## <u>Similes</u>

A simile is a figure of speech that compares two things using the words "like" or "as." They are a powerful tool for creating vivid imagery and adding emphasis to your writing.

A very common way to make similes is to compare people to animals. Here are some examples:

After the last day of school, I was as free as a bird.

Sally was as busy as a bee yesterday.
